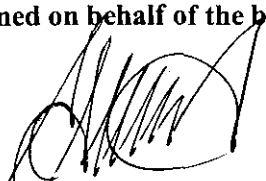

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002).

Turnover

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax, of sales made during the year.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings	-	no depreciation is charged on land and buildings
Other tangible assets	-	
Plant and machinery	-	25% Straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	-	25% Straight line
Motor vehicles	-	25% Straight line

Computer hardware is written off directly to the profit and loss account. In the opinion of the director this policy is necessary to show a true and fair view. For the company to be successful in providing computer services and consultancy it needs to be at the leading edge in respect of computer hardware. As a result upgrades are made on an ongoing basis.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in respect of the tax effect of all timing differences, to the extent that it is probable that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future, at the rate of tax expected to apply when the timing differences reverse
